DAY 1

There's no better place to see Toronto than from atop one of the tallest buildings in the world – the CN Tower. Back at ground level, hop on a guided coach tour to scout out your possibilities for the next four days.

After lunch, head to ultra-chic Bloor-Yorkville, home to designer shops and stylish restaurants. You're just steps away from two of Toronto's cultural transformation projects – the Royal Ontario Museum and the Gardiner Museum of Ceramic Art. Around the corner, the Bata Shoe Museum is home to an incredible 10,000 shoes! And nearby, the Art Gallery of Ontario is undergoing its own renovation. You'll come across countless unique museums and historic sites on your travels throughout the city.

Spend the evening in our Entertainment District – catch the latest smash-hit production, a local indie hit or some improv. This area is also a super-concentrated collection of fine dining eateries and posh nightclubs.

DAY 2

Dedicate some time for shopping at the 300-store Eaton Centre, then decide which way to head next! Shoppers go wild in Toronto's unique districts, including trendy Queen Street West, retro Kensington Market, tempting St. Lawrence Market and historic Distillery District. Follow the PATH – 27 km of underground shopping freedom beneath the city streets.

This afternoon, see Toronto's gleaming skyline from a harbour cruise or a ferry – make a stop on Centre Island, a relaxing car-free escape where you can walk, cycle or rollerblade. Bring a picnic and enjoy the amusement park. Back on shore, there is always something happening at the Harbourfront Centre, home to performing and visual arts. Tour the Toronto Music Garden, inspired by Bach's First Suite for Unaccompanied Cello, with each dance movement corresponding to a different garden section. Or take a streetcar east to The Beach, a neighbourhood filled with quirky shops and hip cafés, lined by a boardwalk and sandy beaches.

This evening, catch one of Toronto's professional sports teams in action at the Rogers Centre (formerly SkyDome) or Air Canada Centre. Or get active yourself! Every winter, a massive ice-skating rink is formed at Toronto's City Hall – free to all.

DAY 3

Families will have a blast in Toronto – chill out in Ontario Place's waterpark, play against Wayne Gretzky in an interactive game at the Hockey Hall of Fame, and step back in time at Fort York. Kids of all ages will be thrilled by a soaring helicopter tour over the city.

Just a short journey from downtown, get 'hands on' at the Ontario Science Centre or say "hello" to the 19th

century at Black Creek Pioneer Village. A whole day can easily be spent at the Toronto Zoo, one of the largest in the world – it has more than 5,000 animals.

Toronto's diverse multiculturalism is evident in its vibrant neighbourhoods. Spend the evening shopping and dining in Chinatown, Little Italy, Greektown, Corso Italia, Portugal Village or Little India – to name a few.

DAY 4

Today, explore Toronto's suburban neighbourhoods, just a short car, bus or train ride from downtown. Be thrilled on an extreme roller coaster at Canada's Wonderland and shop into evening at nearby Vaughan Mills outlet mall. In Kleinburg, view some of our nation's best art at the McMichael Canadian Art Collection. And in Woodbridge, find countless outdoor experiences at the Kortright Centre for Conservation. Shop until you drop at the Heartland Town Centre, then get 'artified' at the Living Arts Centre in Mississauga.
