

# ONTARIO CIRCLE TOUR

## DISCOVERY TOUR - 11 DAYS

Toronto • Niagara Falls • Manitoulin Island • Killarney Provincial Park  
Muskoka • Algonquin Provincial Park • Ottawa • Kingston

### DAY 1 TORONTO

Begin your grand tour of Ontario by rocketing up the CN Tower for a bird's-eye view of Toronto's beautiful skyline. Then embark on a double-decker bus tour of the city's most impressive sights and attractions. After lunch, explore the Royal Ontario Museum and the Art Gallery of Ontario. Dine in the energetic Entertainment District or ultra-chic Bloor-Yorkville.

### DAY 2 TORONTO

Shop away the day at the massive Toronto Eaton Centre, along trendy Queen Street West or in diverse ethnic neighbourhoods. Catch a boat cruise at the waterfront and tour around the Toronto Islands. Then choose from professional sports or the performing arts scene for your evening entertainment.

### DAY 3 TORONTO TO NIAGARA FALLS (130 km)

Now you're off to Niagara Falls. See the thundering falls from various thrilling vantage points, including Journey Behind the Falls, Maid of the Mist and Niagara Helicopters. Browse Niagara-on-the-Lake's unique shops, before slipping into a robe at a quaint country inn. For great eats, go wining and dining in wineries – Niagara has more than 50.

### DAY 4 NIAGARA FALLS TO MANITOULIN ISLAND (370 km)

Take a rural drive to the rugged Bruce Peninsula, where you'll enjoy some of the best hiking Ontario offers. By end of day, board the Chi-Cheemaun ferry and set up camp on the Aboriginal-heritage-rich island of Manitoulin.

## DAY 5

### MANITOULIN ISLAND TO KILLARNEY PROVINCIAL PARK (226 km)

Watch the sun rise over Georgian Bay before touring the island's distinct communities. Let Aboriginal guides introduce you to the symbolism of hoop dancing or traditional crafts. Sample local cuisine and browse local craft stores. Then after a drive to Killarney Provincial Park, set up camp.

## DAY 6

### KILLARNEY PROVINCIAL PARK

Killarney is the ideal destination for outdoor enthusiasts, notably canoeists and hikers. You'll be awed by brilliant white quartzite cliffs of the LaCloche Mountains and the beautiful wind-swept jack pines. Pack a lunch and picnic on the shores of its clear freshwater lakes and rivers.

## DAY 7

### KILLARNEY PROVINCIAL PARK TO MUSKOKA (170 km)

Head south to the picturesque Muskoka region and explore quaint towns such as Huntsville, Bracebridge, Bala and Gravenhurst. From full-service resorts to housekeeping cottages, all with a range of on-site activities, there's a perfect place in Muskoka awaiting you.

## DAY 8

### MUSKOKA TO ALGONQUIN PROVINCIAL PARK (75 km)

Explore the world-renowned Algonquin Provincial Park via waterways and pathways. There are canoe routes and hiking trails for all fitness levels and timelines. In the fall, witness the wonder of the maple trees turning shades of crimson, orange and gold.

## DAY 9

### ALGONQUIN PROVINCIAL PARK TO OTTAWA (350 km)

Drive to Ottawa, Canada's capital city. Take in a free tour of Parliament Hill, the seat of Canadian democracy. Then hop across the Ottawa River for an in-depth look at culture and heritage at the Canadian Museum of Civilization. Come dinnertime, the ByWard Market has eclectic dining choices.

## DAY 10

### OTTAWA TO KINGSTON (175 km)

Stroll the shoreline of the Rideau Canal as it meanders through the city. Experience the rich culture and history of Canada's First People with Aboriginal Experiences. Then drive south for a 1000 Islands cruise on the St. Lawrence River. Follow the river to the 'Limestone City' of Kingston and stay in one of their famed bed and breakfasts or country inns.

## DAY 11

### KINGSTON TO TORONTO (260 km)

Begin with a Confederation Tour Trolley to orientate yourself with the deep history and many attractions Kingston offers. Go on a shopping spree downtown. Listen to cannon fire and watch 19th century military demonstrations at Fort Henry before driving back to Toronto.
